

This course requires a strong understanding of the anatomy and physiology of the ear. Build the knowledge of when to use microsuction, as a technique, with practice and assessments using mannequins to enhance capability, and strengthen patient care.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- Students need to complete the online component before being able
 to book a workshop date. The practical elements will include the
 demonstration and practice of various suturing techniques, use of
 tissue glue and staples to close wounds.
- Each student is provided with their own set of suturing & wound closure resources for use during the course. Simulated wound closure is performed using animal materials to simulate human tissue.

Wound Closure: Advanced Practice

COURSE VALUE

Further development of wound closure knowledge and skills increases capability of wound clinical management across a range of primary healthcare settings including general practice, community-based care, dermatological, and educational. Understand guidelines for administration of local anaesthetics, infection management, postoperative care, MBS billing item numbers, professional indemnity considerations, all covered in this Advanced Practice Program.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- At the successful completion of the Wound Closure: Advanced Practice students will have advanced knowledge and skills to determine the best wound closure technique to achieve durability and simplicity.
- Students will learn the ability to close wounds using a variety of advanced methods and materials including multiple layer closure, elliptical excision and z-plasty Closure.

Perform Peripheral Intravenous Cannulation

Performing Peripheral Intravenous Cannulation (PIC) requires more than just sound knowledge and good technique, there is more to consider such as when to insert, cannula size, insertion site, and managing issues should they arise. The training promotes best practice that can be adapted to support the needs of staff in your organisation who are required to cannulate patients.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

On completion of this program the student should be able to:

- Assess the need for cannulation and correctly identify pathology requests and client
- Perform a cannulation procedure
- Choose the appropriate size cannula
- Discuss the considerations that influence the correct selection of intravenous cannula size and insertion site
- Demonstrate the technique of peripheral intravenous cannula insertion, including securing the cannula insitu
- Manage the cannula until the time it is no longer required and removal of the cannula is to be performed

Managing injuries for patients can be challenging, in primary healthcare, when trying to achieve optimal patient safety and this program is designed to provide a variety of skills that can meet the clinical needs for injury management. An engaging interactive workshop enables the student to effectively manage common injuries that they will see in their workplace.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon successful completion of the program, students should have the practical skills and knowledge to enable them to manage a range of injuries. Practical skills and demonstrations will include:

- Bandaging
- Scaphoid injury management
- Neurovascular and vascular review using doppler
- Head, neck, and cervical immobilisation
- Arm, shoulder, and clavicle immobiliser sling systems
- Upper limb management including circumferential casting, thermoplastic splinting and polymer foam splinting

Clinical Assessment: Managing Emergencies in Primary Healthcare

COURSE VALUE

Develop a greater understanding of Urgent Care Service situations dealt with in Primary Care through a range of specific clinical scenarios and circumstances. For Primary Healthcare staff to build knowledge on when to manage/ escalate emergencies in a primary setting when presented with an injury or illness, including preparing a patient for hospitalisation

- Practical training using theoretical small-group scenarios based on acute presentations and conditions.

Urgent Care Identification (Frontline Staff) (NEW)

Create and build knowledge of triage types and systems that support patients who present to the clinic and may require immediate assistance that you can arrange with the clinical team. - Design your own systems, procedures and protocols with your team to ensure the safe and effective provision of triage in your workplace.

- Outline an appropriate process for telephone triage in general practice that follows safe and effective principles
- Explain the best method used in communicating with agitated or anxious patients, parents or carers

Perform ECG and Basic Rhythm Recognition (NEW)

COURSE VALUE

Monitoring the heart with an ECG provides a clinical picture that is important in determining a patients' cardiovascular health and enables you, as their healthcare practitioner, to identify and diagnose conditions based on the rhythm interpretation. Perform ECG and see how your patient's heart is functioning by learning about lead placement, challenges for good practice, and create an understanding of normal rhythm recognition, and when a patient should be escalated for further diagnostic examination.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Prepare the ECG machine for use
- Prepare the patient to obtain an ECG
- Attach the ECG electrodes correctly
- Perform an ECG tracing
- Understand how the 12-lead ECG is produced
- Understand the wave forms for normal sinus rhythm
- Recognise ECG rhythms that require urgent medical attention.
