




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

Learning outcomes:



Australia has one of the highest rates of skin cancer in the world, and this is treated predominantly within general practice. Crucial to management of skin malignancy is accurate diagnosis. Dermoscopy allows the detection of clinical features invisible to the naked eye, and has been well shown to increase the diagnostic accuracy of users.

In Practical Dermoscopy, General Practitioners learn about the theory of dermoscopy and how to use a dermatoscope in practice to manage patients with skin cancer.



To provide General Practitioners with the skills and knowledge to distinguish a range of benign and precancerous lesions that are often identified by patients as skin lesions of concern and if required provide patients with a recommended treatment plan.



Australia leads the world in the number of diagnosed melanomas and this course will provide you with knowledge on how to identify, differentiate and evaluate melanoma and other skin cancers.



To provide General Practioners with the skills and knowledge to perform basic dermatological surgery and procedures (cryotherapy, biopsies, electrodessication and curettage, intralesional steroid injection, sutures and suturing) and understand the principles of full thickness skin grafts, split thickness skin grafts, principles of flap repairs, regional closures) and how to manage surgical risk and complications.

At this workshop GPs put dermoscopy theory into practice and develop a thorough understanding of how dermoscopy can be used to manage patients with skin cancer.
